VETERAN LAND GRANTS The Certificates Are Being Signed

The department of crown lands, Toronto, is pushing forward as rapidly as possible the issue of certificates showing that applicants are entitled to grants, for volunteer services critical times in Canada. Hon. E. Davis is signing these as rapidly as the limited time he can just now give to his department will allow.
