

The diminution was capecially noticeable in the western and midland sections of the province, the lew localities in which a slight crease was recorded being in the eastern part. Six counties only had over twenty five per cent. of woodland, all of which were in the east Ten counties had less than twenty-five per cent, and over twenty per cent, of woodland; sixteen counties had less than twenty per cent. and over per cent., and eleven counties less than ten per cent. In the case of many townships the denudation been even greater. A list of forty-four townships is given where the timber covered land is less than five cent: of the total area. The report points out that the country is beginning to feel seriously the effects of over clearance. 
