London, June 17.—The Times publishes an article on South African casualties from its actuarial correspondent, which says that, excepting the first year's fighting, when losses by battle and diseases were very heavy, the casualties in South Africa compare favorably with those of most recent campaigns for which trustworthy figures are obtainable.
