W. C. Vanderlip, a Boston lawyer, admits embezzling \$100,000 from estates he managed.

According to the pope's plan, the friars will leave Manila in small numbers at different times.

J. Payment Morgan, has purchased from the Countess of Dudley her handsome London house.

At Shenandoah, Pa., perfect quiet continued among the strikers last night and this morning.

Eugene Mason, Oak Corners, near Rochester, N.Y., was killed by a passenger train on Thursday night.
