BIG FRAUD IN HUNGARY.

More Than \$1,000,000 Stolen by Officers.

Berlin, Aug. 7.—Enormous frauds on the part of municipal authorities have been discovered in the town of Mariathesenopol, Hungary. A sum amounting to 1,800,000 kroner (\$300,000) has disappeared from the city chest and the misapplication of between 5,000,000 and 6,000,000 kroner has been traced to fourteen officers, who have been arrested.
