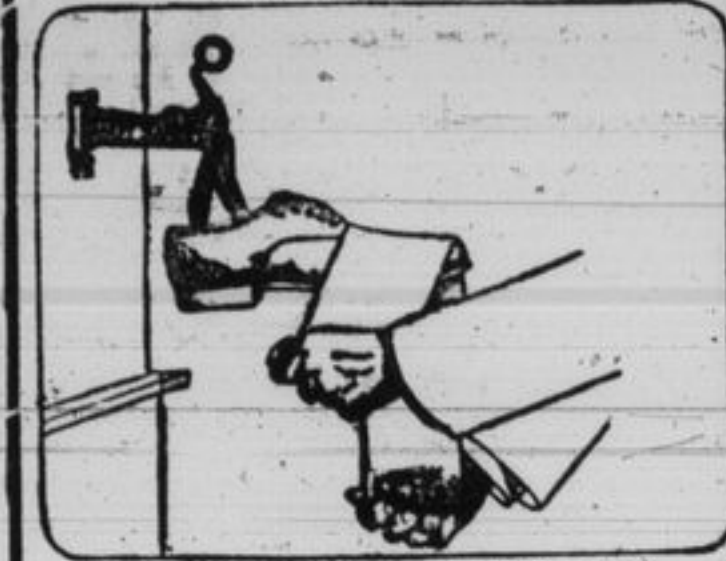

THE CAPTURE OF OSWEGO

SOME PARTICULARS OF THAT HISTORIC EVENT.

Montcalm's Victory in 1756—The Fort Captured by the Canadians and British in 1814—Lieut. Hewett's Conspicuous Bravery—Some Notes by a Kingstonian.

In the Whig of July 5th appeared an article by Mr. Mott, of Oswego, relative to the dedication of a tablet there at the spot where once stood the old fort which was captured by the British and Canadians during the war of 1812-14 and by the French in 1756.

Captured By The French. The first authentic record of the capture of Oswego is found in the journal of the command of Maj.-Gen. Cornwallis.

After the peace of Aix la Chapelle, October, 1748, ten regiments were ordered to be disbanded, and Maj.-Gen. Cornwallis' regiment was included in this order.
