Toronto Sun.

There appear to be rather more potatoes in the country this year than usual.

Along the line of the C.P.R. from Owen Sound to Toronto, the number of large potato fields is particularly noticeable, the big prices of last year having evidently served as an incentive to wide planting this year.

As already intimated in the Sun, there is a prospect of an unusually large crop of potatoes in the United States, and consequently little hope of a demand from that country for the products of the Canadian fields.

This being so and our own prospects of yield being good—the price will probably rule low in Ontario this year.

Speaking on this point, Andrew Elliott said: "There are few feeds on which pigs will make better gains than bran and potatoes; but the potatoes require to be boiled to give the results hoped for.

If potatoes rule as low as expected through the coming winter, producers cannot use them to better purpose than applying them to the making of bacon."
