



### PRODIGAL BACK

### BRITAIN'S WELCOME TO THE REBELS OF BOERLAND.

A Funny Spectacle in New York—Keene a Napoleon on the Stock Market—Sought His Foe in the Thickest of the Fight.

of warships than we have. She has hundreds of able commanders and thousands as brave men as ever fought for supremacy on a vessel's deck. Close your eyes for a moment. Where at Trafalgar, Nelson sinks dying on the deck of the Victory, his last fight and each intervening thought is for his country. For the time death is swallowed up in victory. Listen to his admonition, almost at the moment when the spirit was passing the veil: "England expects every man to do his duty." That admonition ringing down through the ages for all time has conferred on the brave and intrepid sailor an immortality which can only die when England perishes and lies dead in the wreck and time is lost in eternity. Yet the Victory would hardly serve a tender to those mighty giants which are now endeavoring to solve the mystery which lies between the power of defense and attack. Every incident of actual war is sought out and every possible sacrifice guarded against, but the results obtained are as yet only on the verge of possibility. For the tremendous miracles that are yet unrevealed in these ocean giants, the uninitiated can only watch and wait. As an illustration of this knowledge of the new power that now governs the sea we need only cite the war between China and Japan. China had many times the territory, nearly five times the population and wealth sufficient for the lavish expenditure of a cruel and costly government. In war she had a mightier navy than Japan. She could procure with her lavish wealth every appliance for success upon the sea.

China was ignorant, Japan was enlightened and progressive. She sent her sons abroad to learn war's latest appliances. When the time to use that knowledge came she battered down the walls of her ancient enemy like a house of cards. Things To Remember. Take extra care of bread and cake boxes in hot weather. Bake your bread in small ovens and very thoroughly, else the uncooked germs in the centre will speedily destroy the loaf. Nothing is more indigestible than stale baked bread, and yet many people have the taste to prefer it in that raw state. Good flour is a creamy color and holds together upon pressure. If baskets of soft berries must stand over night turn them on platters and remove those unfit to use, separate the rest and stand in a cool airy place, not on ice. Wash small fruits by putting them in a few at a time in a wire sieve or colander. Eat fruit or anything else merely to save it, is not digestible economy. If children have food on their plates do not compel or hire them to eat, but serve them with less and avoid waste. Grown-up children often leave very untidy plates at table. Is it custom or lack of training? It is a misfortune for any child to be untaught in table requirements. Unless they are observing their lack of teaching will follow them through life.
