WALKED IN RAIN PARADE OF THE LABOR UNIONS MONDAY.

Fair Grounds' Events Postponed Till Saturday—Procession and Line of March—The Sun Finally Shone Forth.

The parade was thus constituted: Mounted Marshals—W. Cockade and W. Maiden. Union Jack. Foot marshals—R. J. Bennett, W. O'Brien, W. Clugston.

U.C. BIBLE SOCIETY.

Annual Report Shows Good Work Done. By Rev. J. A. McDonald, B.A., special correspondent.

The sixty-second report of the Upper Canada Bible Society has been published. The year ending March 31st, 1902, is the seventy-third year of the society's operation.

The object of the society, as stated in the report, is to convert the word of God in all languages and in all lands—a work in which all Christians must feel a deep interest.

Three cohorts of the society labored in the districts of Muskoka, Algonia and Manitoulin Island, four in the province of Manitoba, and one in British Columbia. The total circulation of copies in the whole or portions of scriptures was 20,922 last year, or 1,877,091 since its commencement.

The total receipts were over \$31,000, while the expenditure amounted to about the same sum. Of the receipts over \$20,000 came from the branch societies as free contributions. Over \$9,000 was sent to the parent society—the British and foreign, with headquarters in London, England, the total publication of which society last year was over 5,000,000 bibles or portions.

The contributions from Kingston and its district branches are: Kingston & Portsmouth, \$104 25; Interest on legacy and deposit, 33 69; Pittsburgh, South, 35 22; Pittsburgh, North, 17 32; Wolfe Island, 24 22; Cataraqui Island, 9 30; Obedia, 18 81; Sunbury, 15 63; Bath, 11 60; Harrowsmith, 11 42; Cataraqui, 2 05.

Branch societies in Battershall, Inverary, Sycamore, Wilbur and Bagh Road, Glenvale and Edinburg have not reported.

In view of the fact that the parent society is somewhat behind financially in endeavoring to answer all calls upon it, that the year 1901 will be the centenary of the British and Foreign Bible Society, and that of the bountiful harvest in Ontario this year, largely increased contributions are expected.
