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WAS IT STOLEN?

SEARCH AT COLLEGE FOR "DIDO'S" BODY.

College Authorities Say it is Not There—One That Appears Like it—A Military Funeral Arranged.

It was fully expected that the body of James Higginbotham, "Dido" for short, would be secured from Queen's medical college this afternoon, and prepared for burial.

Last night, Sergt.-Maj. O'Hagan, acting on behalf of the men of the Royal Canadian Field Artillery, waited upon county crown attorney Whiting and the police magistrate, and secured this order:

"Office of county crown attorney, Kingston, September 2nd, 1902.—To any and all persons having possession of the body of the late James Higginbotham, commonly known as "Dido," I hereby order and authorize you to deliver the body of James Higginbotham, commonly known as "Dido," to the Sergt.-Maj. O'Hagan, a friend of the deceased.—John Duff, Police Magistrate."

"I would ask your worship to grant the above order.—J. L. Whiting, County Crown Attorney." This written order was then placed in the hands of S. Reid, of the undertaking establishment of James Reid & Co., who went at nine o'clock this morning to Dr. Mylks, demonstrator of anatomy at Queen's, and he countersigned the order, authorizing the caretaker to hand over the body to the bearer, Mr. Reid, who proceeded to the college, where he presented his authority. When the dissecting room was searched, "Dido's" body could not be identified, and it was feared it had been taken away, as such a rumor was whispered about last night.

Sergt.-Maj. O'Hagan was sent for, and an hour was spent looking over the bodies. The searchers were partially convinced that a certain body was that of "Dido," but the top of the head was off it, and identification was difficult.

This afternoon at two o'clock, a police constable was to go to the college and assist in identifying the remains. The college authorities informed the searchers that the body was not there, and that it had evidently been stolen.

The sergeant-major demanded that "Dido's" body be delivered to him, but was again told it was not there. The party then proceeded to make a further search.

At 4 p.m.—Body not recovered.

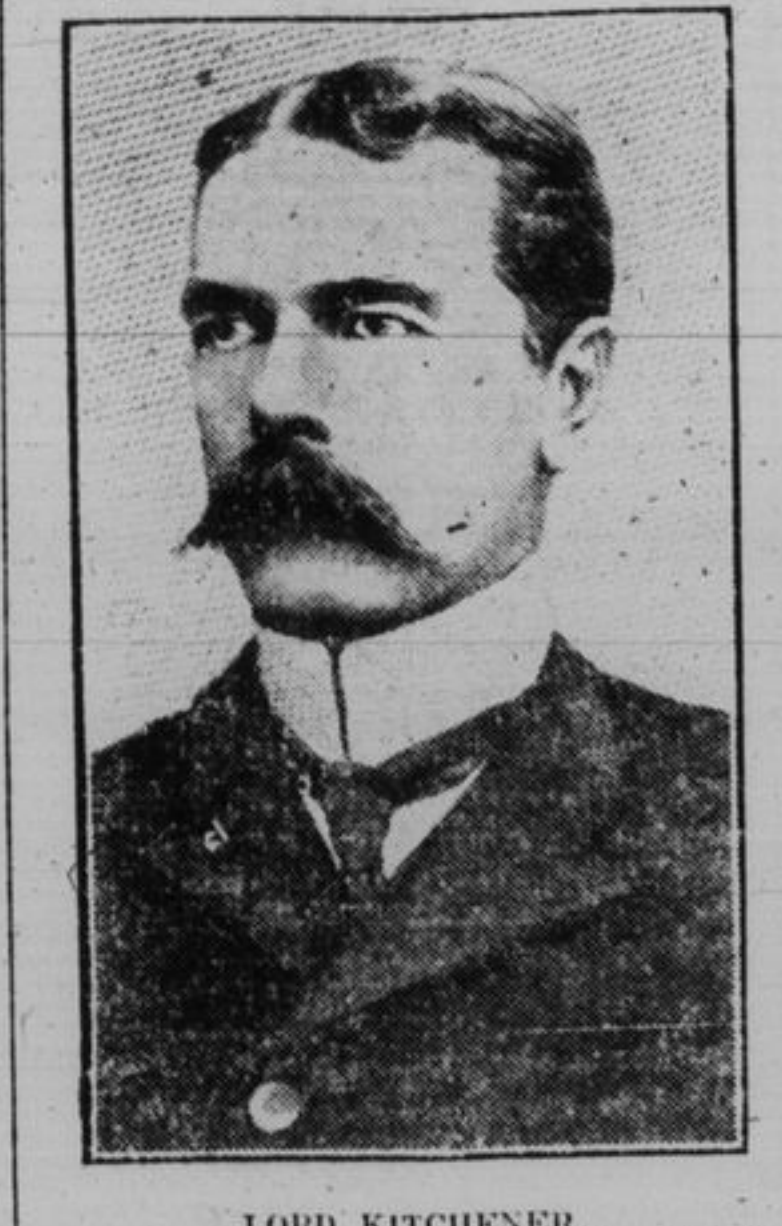
Montreal, Sept. 3.—Louis Cohen, the New York man arrested here on a charge of stealing diamonds, will be released on a writ of habeas corpus.
