

#### COMMERCIAL MATTERS.

##### What Is Going On In the Business World—The Market News.

The Canadian wheat crop is estimated at 93,720,000 bushels, with a surplus of 23,820,000 bushels.

Business failures for last week numbered fourteen, as compared with fourteen in the same week last year.

Cheese sales: Brockville, 9½c.; Perth, 9½c.; Napanee, 9½c.; South Finch, 9½c.; Kempville, 9½c.; Ottawa, 9½c.; 10c.; 9½c.

The wheat crop of the United States is estimated at 646,100,000 bushels, with a surplus of 210,160,000 bushels.

The European wheat crop is estimated to give an increase of 193,120,000 bushels over the crop of 1901. A decrease of 136,320,000 bushels is expected in the European corn crop.

Treasurer W. F. Ryan, of the Syracuse Stock and Grain company, states that the company has secured financial assistance and hopes to reopen the main office and all branches in New York state and Canada at once.

##### WORLD'S BIGGEST TREE.

Measures Only 109 Feet At The Base.

San Francisco, Sept. 8.—A few weeks ago there was discovered to the east of Fresno, in the Sierras, the biggest tree in the world. At the time it was said that it measured 150 feet in circumference.

John Muir, the great naturalist, has

visited the tree and reports that it

measures 109 feet at the base. The

tree is believed to be the largest in the world.
