Montreal, Sept. 8.—At the Anglican synod this morning the title of the church was discussed and the selection of one left to a committee. There is a feeling that the present title, the Church of England in the Dominion of Canada, is too cumbersome, and suggestions for a change were made, among the most important being the Anglican church in Canada, the Anglican-Catholic church of Canada, and the Episcopal church of Canada.

Part Of A Wreck. Southampton, Ont., Sept. 8.—This morning one of the fishing boats from this place, discovered parts of a wreck, about twenty miles west of here in Lake Huron and towed it to shore. The wreckage is about fifteen feet long and appears to be the stern and part of the deck of a small yacht. Besides letters on the stern-give the name "Louise" and part of hull "Port Clinton" Nothing was attached to the wreckage.

MORMONS FOR CANADA. Converts To Settle North Of The Rocky Mountains. Valdosta, Ga., Sept. 8.—A carload of Mormon converts has left this city over the Atlantic Coast line for Leitchfield, Canada, far to the north of the Rocky Mountains.
