



NEED NOT Worry Anybody After This.

London, Sept. 15.—Dr. Stephen Page, a surgeon in the West London hospital, announces that he can furnish bridges for noses that have been broken and sunken. In all that is required is a needle syringe and solidified paraffin with the melting point at 115 degrees. The skin of the nose is nicked with a scalpel at the point where the surgery is to be performed. The needle is then inserted and this introduces the paraffin, heated to the melting point underneath the skin. A firm pressure then moulds the paraffin into shape and furnishes a bridge covered with healthy skin without a scar.

PEACE AT THE CAPE.

Martial Law Will Soon be Repealed.

Cape Town, Sept. 16.—In an interview Attorney-General S. L. Graham said:

"The general indemnity act will be gone in a day or two, when martial law will be repealed throughout the colony. Simultaneously the government will proclaim the peace preservation act, enabling it to control the possession, importation and distribution of all arms and all ammunition. Profound peace reigns throughout the colony."

THAT FOOT NOTE.

The Methodist Church Refuses to Make Any Change.

Winnipeg, Sept. 16.—The vexed question which has agitated Methodist conferences for many years came up again last night for discussion, but as in previous years, the church's highest court refused to make any change in the "foot note," and added emphasis by refusing to deliberate the subject. This end was not reached without the consumption of considerable time, however, and the source of irritation which a considerable number of delegates were unable to conceal.

ALL Depends on Deverey.

New York, Sept. 16.—All New York is awaiting with keenest interest the result of the Tammany primaries being held to-day. The contest will result in the reconstruction of the Tammany machine, no matter who wins, because it is a foregone conclusion that the triumvirate—"Joko," Hoffen, "Two-Spot," McMahon, and "Sport," Murphy, as "Big Bill" Deverey calls them, will triumph from their burlesque attempts at running the organization in the absence of Croker.

If John C. Sheehan, of the Greater New York Democratic, can elect six or seven men, he will gain the support of a number of leaders who are not loyal to Croker. But the majority of leaders do not believe that Sheehan will carry any districts, particularly in view of the personal fight being waged by Deverey against him in the Ninth district, where his influence was the strongest.

If Deverey should win, Carroll and his followers would seek to accomplish the permanent retirement of Croker

and his friends with the object of gaining control of the machine. It is the universal verdict that everything depends upon the result of the strenuous fight Deverey has been waging for weeks past in the Ninth.

To Consider Registration.

London, Sept. 16.—Arrangements are being made for the king's visit to the city and drive through South London. The probable date is October 1st.

The day after the visit the king will be a shagreening service at Westminster Abbey. The route will be similar to that fixed for the king's procession on June 27th, but the affair will be extremely simple. Only a few escort will be provided.
