WITH A CLEAVER

DRINK-CRAZED POLE AT TACKS FAMILY

The Girl Nearly Killed—Capture of the Assailant—Little Son Escaped by Hiding—The Boy's Story.

Detroit, Sept. 22.—In a drunken frenzy, Ernest Mansfield, a Polish painter, aged thirty-three, attempted to murder his whole family with a meat cleaver, at their little home, Canfield avenue east. His fourteen-year-old daughter Mary, the first attacked, he hacked four times about the head and shoulders with the terrible weapon, and she is now at Harper hospital in a serious condition. The maidman's wife was rescued just in time to escape death.

Pursued by her husband after his attack on the little girl, the mother ran into the front yard. Just as she was about to open the gate the would-be murderer reached her and struck her a blow on the shoulder with the weapon that cut through her clothes and felled her bleeding to the ground. A neighbor, Leo Feurst, reached Mansfield just in time to prevent him committing murder.

Mansfield then took to his heels, but was later arrested and is now held on a charge of attempted murder. Beanie, the little ten-year-old son of the murderous parent, escaped injury by hiding. The little fellow, still trembling with terror told in his childlike way of the drunken frenzy of his father.

"I came home," said he, "just before I was going to bed at nine o'clock. He was awful cross and he said to me and Mary that he was going to kill them and me, and after he killed us he was going to kill the priest."

"He had his eye on me and he said he didn't care how small I was he'd kill me, too. I was afraid and I cried. I wanted to run away, but I didn't dare."

Then pa went out into the woodshed and ma looked out and she came back and told us that he was sharpening the cleaver that we cut meat with."

"Ma didn't think he would hurt us, and Ma didn't either, but he said he was going to kill me, and I was so scared that I run out doors and hid behind the back fence."

True to his word, after sharpening his cleaver, Mansfield came back into the house and proceeded to carry out his murderous intentions.

He started for his wife first, but the daughter attempted to reason with her parent, and was assailed first by the frenzied man. She tried to run, but was struck repeatedly, and fell unconscious to the floor.

Thinking he had killed the child, Mansfield went for the mother, and but for the arrival of help would undoubtedly have killed the woman.

New York Republicans Favor Another Term For Roosevelt.

Saratoga, N.Y., Sept. 22.—The republican state convention will assemble in this city to-morrow to nominate candidates for governor, lieutenant-governor and other state offices to be filled at the November election. The state ticket has been practically agreed upon by Senator Platt and the state organization and the convention will not be enlivened by any contests for nomination.
