Spencer Says the People Looked Like Black Ants.

London, Sept. 23.—Stanley Spencer, the aeronaut, who travelled thirty miles over London in an air ship of his own invention, said in an interview: "All one time I feared an explosion of the balloon, but the automatic valve prevented a catastrophe. The engine also threatened to ignite the gas of the balloon, but this danger was also overcome. I had the machine under perfect control and could turn in any direction. The people in the London thoroughfares looked like black ants."

"When I alighted the machine came down so lightly that a child might have been under it without being hurt. The distance covered was much further than at first reported, being fully thirty miles. I dropped balls at 100 yards. It shows what an army would do with an air ship carrying bombs. My ship differs from Santos-Dumont's in being propelled from the front, and it is thus drawn along. Its speed is 7.8 miles an hour. My present ship is a one-man affair, but I can make one to accommodate any reasonable number of persons."

VERY SIMPLE

WAS THE FUNERAL OF BELGIUM'S QUEEN.

ARE INDIGNANT

AT TREATMENT ACCORDED PRINCESS STEPHANIE.

Body Blow From Joseph Chamberlain—British Match Industry Injured By United States Competition—Arrogance of Public Servants.

London, Sept. 23.—The British match-making industry has been reduced by American competition to a deplorable condition. Several British firms have determined to leave business rather than manufacture at a loss.

The special correspondent of the Morning Post, in a description of the International exhibition of modern decorative art at Turin, says the first place, except in regard to pottery, must be assigned to the United States. It is interesting to note, he adds, that all the best results in gold and silversmith work are obtained by hand hammering.

In an election speech, says a despatch from Melbourne to the Times, the premier appealed for support for the government in order to enable it to retrench. He spoke strongly about the arrogance of public servants, and asked the electors to prevent them from governing the country.

A Morning Leader despatch from Brussels says that the general impression there is one of amazement at the extreme to which the simplicity of the funeral of the late Queen of the Belgians was carried. Public opinion, the despatch adds, is highly excited and indignant at the manner in which the Princess Stephanie was treated at Spa, and several of the newspapers comment on the action of the king.

The Times states that the attention of Mr. Chamberlain has been called to a statement by Pitt-Lewis, ex-Liberal Unionist member of parliament, that the Liberal Unionists at the formation of the party in 1885 gave a pledge that they would never accept office as a party, hence their action in 1895 was a gross breach of faith and honour. Mr. Chamberlain in a letter denied that such a pledge was ever made by responsible Liberal-Unionists. He adds that unless he is much mistaken Pitt-Lewis must have been at one time the chief of the Unionist Administration.

A local grain exporter makes the somewhat startling statement that fully one-third of the wheat crop will be more or less damaged by frost north and west of Rapid City and westward along the main line of the C. P. R. He says wheat has in a great many places been touched by frost and while perhaps no great damage has been done, the grade has been materially reduced with a consequent loss to the farmers. In many sections the grain is not yet cut and is daily becoming more liable to the frost, while grain from points in Southern Manitoba, where no frosts were reported, is being received in Winnipeg, which, when inspected, is found to be considerably damaged by frost.

MORE RUSSIAN CUNNING.

Secure Valuable Concessions From China And Thibet.

Pekin, Sept. 22.—The publication by native papers of an alleged agreement between the Tartar general commanding in the Amur district and the Russians, conceding to the latter mining rights, has excited the keenest interest. It is alleged that the Russians have already established five mining stations pending the throne's approval of the agreement. The board of foreign affairs declares that there are no documents in its records giving the Russians exclusive mining concessions in Manchuria. It adds, however, that it is possible that its concessions were signed by Li Hung Chang or San Fu, previous to the establishment of the board of foreign affairs. It is believed that the report of the conclusion of a treaty between Russia and Thibet, providing for the transfer of Thibet to the United States by way of Vladivostock.

A despatch from Alexandria says that the cholera statistics for Egypt on Thursday were: Cairo, 15 deaths; Alexandria, 21 deaths; other districts, 558 fresh cases and 781 deaths.

The young woman who committed suicide in a Montreal hotel last week travelled from Toronto to Montreal on Conductor Bartlett's train. Her identity has not yet been established.

Yu Jung, a young Chinaman, aged twenty, was incarcerated in Ogdensburg, N.Y., jail, on a charge of attempting to evade payment of bounty fee, died there of consumption.

The annual convention of the Indiana State Federation of Labor began a three days' session at Evansville, to-day. Reports of officers show the state federation to be in a prosperous condition.

His majesty's torpedo boat destroyer Velox has just passed herself to be the fastest vessel in the world, for she has made a speed of 33.61 knots, which is almost equivalent to forty miles an hour.

The body of a man named Napoleon Corbin was found this morning cut in two by the cars on the C.P.R. track east of St. Maurice river bridge, Three Rivers, Que. It is not known how the accident occurred.
