

REVOLUTION IN OIL INDUSTRY. Fuel Oil on Ocean Steamers.

IEUTENANT WINCHELL, U.S.N., reports the trial trip of 6,876 miles by the oil-burning steamer Mariposa as entirely satisfactory. It practically required 11/2 pounds of oil an hour to secure a horse-power, which is just about 50% less in weight of combustion than would be required of coal. The Mariposa steamed an average of 354 knots a day, burning an average of 278 barrels of oil a day. In consequence of burning oil the Mariposa reduced her complement from 81 to 65 men.
