New York, Sept. 25.—With material to work upon gathered from the republican state convention, the democrats go to Saratoga to-day and tomorrow to prepare for their state convention which opens Tuesday.

So much has been written about the recent primary contests in New York, with "Big Bill" Devery as the central figure, until many are inclined to think that there is some salary or official position attached to the leadership of a district.

The right kind of a man occupying such a position has it in his power to do a great deal of good. He is the person to whom everyone in the district goes who wants anything. But men of the Devery type do not seek leadership for any such reason.

The subway which is expected to revolutionize intramural transportation, is approaching completion with astonishing rapidity.

FORGER LIVED IN STYLE.

Lavish Establishment at Kingston-Upon-Thames.

London, Sept. 25.—L. H. Greig, a book-keeper in the London offices of the Carnegie Steel company, remanded in the Mansion House police court on the charge of having forged cheques amounting to \$9,500, purporting to have been signed by Col. Millard Hunsicker, chairman of the Nickel corporation, was again remanded to-day after a brief hearing.

Counsel handed in forged cheques for \$30,000 and \$30,000 respectively. He said the forgeries were all of great magnitude. The prisoner, he declared, kept up a lavish establishment at Kingston-upon-Thames, and steps were being taken to prevent the removal of his handsome furniture.

Col. Hunsicker said subsequently that some of the money had been recovered, but that the loss would probably amount to \$75,000.

BOLD KIDNAPPERS.

Ransom is Demanded For Family of Rich Chinaman.

Butte, Mont., Sept. 26.—The wife and child of Chin Quon, one of the wealthiest Shanses in the North-West, were kidnapped last night from his home in the Chinese quarter. Two men and a woman drove up to the house and entered. Later they emerged with the woman and child, who seemed gagged.

Neighbors tried to interfere, but the kidnapers drew revolvers and drove them off, threatening the crowd. The police were unable to find any trace of the kidnapers. Quon found a note under his door saying that he could recover the two by leaving \$2,000 in a canyon in the mountains.
