STEEL TRUST. IN NINE MONTHS EARNED OVER \$100,000,000.

Directors of Corporation Issue Statement and Declare the Usual Dividends—Undivided Profits Are \$34,647,982. New York, Oct. 8.—The directors of the United States Steel Corporation have issued a statement of net earnings for the nine months of the year ending September 30th. Earnings for July, August and September, with the last month estimated, aggregate \$36,764,643; total net earnings for the nine months, deducting each month's expenses for ordinary repairs, renewals and maintenance of plant, also interest on bonds and fixed charges of the subsidiary companies, aggregate \$101,142,158. The usual quarterly dividends of one and three-quarter per cent. on the preferred and one per cent. on the common were declared.
