

Emigration From Village to City Should Stop.

The physicians, statesmen and philanthropists interested in the tuberculosis problem have, besides working for the better housing of the poor and the creation of special institutions for the treatment of consumptives, an additional mission to perform, The tide of emigration from village to city should be reversed.
