Ottawa, Oct. 21.—Hon. Mr. Tarte is no longer a member of the government. His resignation was sent to Sir Wilfrid Laurier, yesterday, and today was accepted by the premier.

The minister in his letter to the premier pointed out that the objections to his utterances on the tariff raised by Sir Wilfrid, himself, led to his resignation.

Mr. Tarte's letter was written in friendly strain, wishing Sir Wilfrid speedy restoration to health and conveying his wishes for the future welfare of his colleagues.

Mr. Tarte said he preferred freedom of speech to the great honor of being a minister.

Sir Wilfrid's Reply.

In his letter of acceptance Sir Wilfrid points out that the consequence of his attitude led him to inform his excellency that he would, of necessity, have to demand Mr. Tarte's resignation of the portfolio.

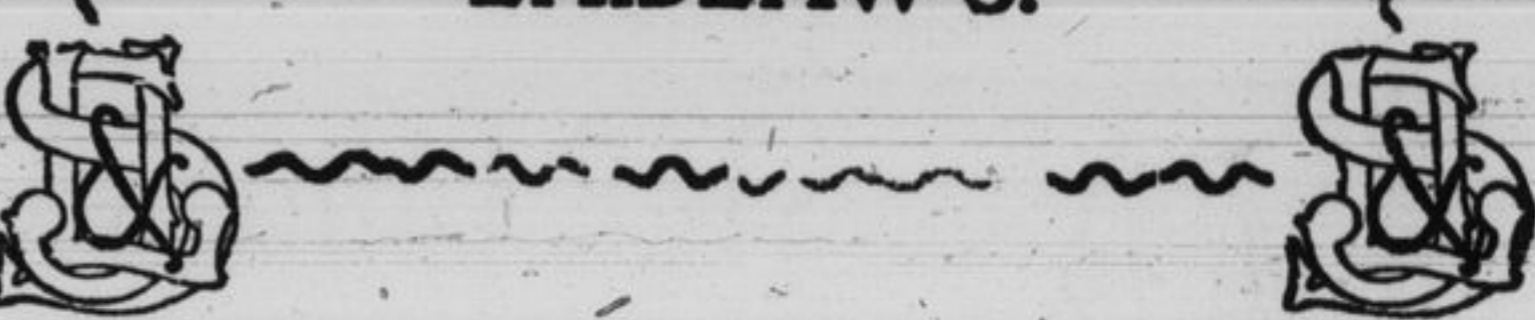
