

A STREET DISPLAY.

Unique Method of Advertising-Work Well Done.

The Gilmour Travelling Street Dis play company has completed several days of good advertising work in Kingston. Their display waggon has attracted large crowds at all times and their method is the most nov and unique that has yet appeared. The large waggon is very attractively decorated, the horses are gaily caparisoned and decked with chiming bells. The bugle call from the man on the front seat attracts the notice of the passing throngs. The moving signs, bearing advertisements of several wellknown firms, take their turn in being presented to view. The constant change gives a sort of moving-picture effect, which catches and holds the eve of the spectator.

The following well-established firms are thus being advertised: The Daily Mail and Empire, the Dunlop Tire company, Comfort Soap, Shredged Wheat, the W. & D. Dineen company, furriers, Parker's Dve Works, the Ca nadian Premier Manufacturing com pany, all of Toronto; the F. F. Dalle company, Tiger Stove Polish, Hamil ton; the Gurney-Tilden company, stoves, Hamilton; and the George F Tuckett company, cigars and tobacco.

He has thoroughly covered the city, and distributed from 4,000 5,000 booklets among the citizens. The success of the early bicyclecompanies, when the newspapers and weeklies were full of their advertisements, was phenomenal; but when the bicycle combination was formed, including all the leading American companies, the managers undertook to re trench in all departments and began by almost abandoning the advertising field, Colonel Pope objected to the eli mination of this publicity. He knew by experience that advertising paid hand somely, and he realized precisely what would happen if advertising were dis continued-that public interest in th sport would diminish, as it did, unti it almost died out. The failure of th American Bievele company, with enor mous liabilities and small assets, is therefore not surprising, though when it was organized, only three years ago, its prospectus set forth that the company would probably earn twenty per cent on its common shares.

A FORTUNE UNDERGROUND.

Lord Dudley Has a Coal Mine Yielding \$200,000 a Year.

It is stated that the new coalfield which has been discovered on Local Dudley's Staffordshire estate is destined to become one of the richest mines in the neighborhood, it being estimated that during the next eighty years it will be capable of yielding some 1,500 tons of coal per day. Taking an average of five days a week,-an i cw mines work more, and many less this works out at a total of 390,000 tons of coal a year. According to the latest returns available, Staffordshire coal at the pit-mouth is worth about seven shillings a ton, so that the total yearly value of his lordship's new acquisition will amount to £136,000. Taking the eighty years mentioned, fature has bestowed on his lordship a little gift amounting to at least £10,920,000. Probably, when working expenses, royalties, etc., have been ac counted for, there will be left a profit of nearly £40,000 a year-a substanial increase to Lord Dudley's alrea. princely revenues, and just twice, as much as he will receive from the state as viceroy of Ireland.
