Are The Boxers To Kill Foreigners

MAKING RAIDS

UPON VILLAGES IN THE SOUTH OF CHINA.

And Forcing the Government Troops to Flee—Posting Placards in the Province of Sze Chuan—The Foreign Devils Must be Exterminated.

Victoria, B.C., Nov. 24.—Advices have been received from South China that the Kwangsi rebels have invaded Kuei Chou province, proclaiming their object to ravage Kuei province, but as their placards put it, only to borrow a passage to Sze Chuan, whither they are bound to assist the Boxers of that province.

They invaded Hsing-yih-sien, in Kuei Chou, which fell into their hands, and many of the villagers, who had held out for eight days, were slaughtered. The government troops sent to relieve the place were within one day's march when it fell, and, hearing of the success of the rebels, retired to Kwangsi borders.

The Boxers in Sze Chuan are posting placards in the villages stating that with the authority of Tao Chouin, their patron, and at the will of the sage Confucius, they will fulfill the will of heaven by murdering all the foreign devils in China who continue to propagate their doctrines and exterminate all who enter their churches or become their followers.

TEMPERANCE BEVERAGES.

Made Out of Wine, Beer and Spirits.

London, Nov. 24.—Dr. Pitoy, the French scientist, in an article just published, holds out hope that the difficulty of providing a satisfactory temperance drink has at last been solved, and this not by a new beverage but a series of new drinks, every wine, beer and spirit now being provided with a non-alcoholic understry.

Mr. Pitoy says he has discovered that fermentation is the work of a certain micro-organism, which he has succeeded in isolating and providing with a separate existence. It is said that this method of fermentation instead of decomposing glucose in the proportion of one part of carbonic acid to two of alcohol, as by the old process, causes the latter two parts to assume the form of a non-alcoholic substance. It is inferred that beers and wines submitted to the new fermentation will emerge as temperance beverages.
