



### A FATAL JOKE

GOMRADES BLOW UP BOY WITH AIR PUMP.

The Youths Are Now Under Arrest, Accused of Murder-The Boy's Stomach Was Greatly Distended.

New York, Dec. 5 .- Harry Ruit, an employee of a locomotive works in Paterson, N.J., died in a hospital there yesterday, as a result of a practical joke played on him by five of his fellow-employees. They were arrested, charged with having caused his death. It is alleged that they "blew up" Ruit with a pneumatic air pump having a pressure of 110 pounds to the inch. Soon after this the boy's stomach became greatly distended. After several hours of great suffering he died. When the men accused of having caused Ruit's death were arraigned in court in Paterson, the dead boy's father rushed at one of them, named Dorn, knocked him down and started to kick him. The father was restrained by the court officers. The accused men were held without bail on a charge of manslaughter:


