

MEATS AND POULTRY.

Choice Beef Scarce and Wanted-

Lambs Fairly Active. Montreal, Dec. 17.-There has been considerable enquiry during the past few days for choice dressed beef, o which the offerings this season so far have been small, owing to the keen demand for such cattle for export ac count. However, Nelson Bickerdike, Gosford street, has succeeded in obtaining the first full carload of choice beef from Toronto for the Christmas trade, which he is offering at 71c. to Sic. per lb., for hindquarters, and at 5c. to 6c. for fronts. In addition to the above Mr. Bickerdike has received one carload of extra choice young lambs which are selling readily at 6ac. to 7c. per lb., and one carload of choice frozen hogs, consisting chiefly of lightweights, and selling at \$7.75 per 100 lbs. The demand mutton is only fair at 5c. per lb., but there it a good enquiry for yeal, which is scarce at 5c. to 8c. per lin. Receipts of poultry continue exceedingly small for the season, and, consequence, the market is anything but well supplied. The demand good for all lines, and prices are very firm, with an upward tendency. Choice turkeys sold at 131c. to 14c. ordinary, at 121c. to 13c.; chickens, at 10c. to 11c.; chicks at 10c. to 12c., and geese at 7c. to 9c. per lb.


