

> Passing Of Canadian Forests. Senator Alger recently sounded note of warning about the rapid disforestation of the Province of Ontario. The enormous growth of the pulp industry is one of the causes of this. Two pulp mills at Sault Ste. Marie turn out 250 tons of finished product a day, which is itself an enormous drain on the forests in that neighbor hood. It is interesting to know that the amount of lumber and timber used each year by the railways of this country is greater than the entire an nual manufactured output of the stat of Michigan. Senator Alger says that unless Ontario speedily passes laws, making it necessary to replant land as soon as the first growth is cut off, the day will soon come when the Canadian forests will be like Michi gan's, practically worthless.
