BY THE COUNCIL OF THE BOARD OF TRADE.

Various Communications Dealt With—Committee Appointed to Assist in the Summer Hotel Scheme.

A meeting of the council of the board of trade was held yesterday afternoon in the office of the secretary, Francis King.

The minutes disclosed the fact that two meetings of the council of the board had been called recently, but that no quorum had been obtained on account of various other matters, which had prevented attendance of the members.

The Chamber of Commerce in Montreal, sent a communication asking the board to support their proposition that action be taken to bring about the appointment of Lord Strathcona, as the next governor general of Canada.

The Single Tax Association in Toronto asked for support of a proposition to memorialize the government to make the new transcontinental railway a government enterprise and to issue it only with grants of land.

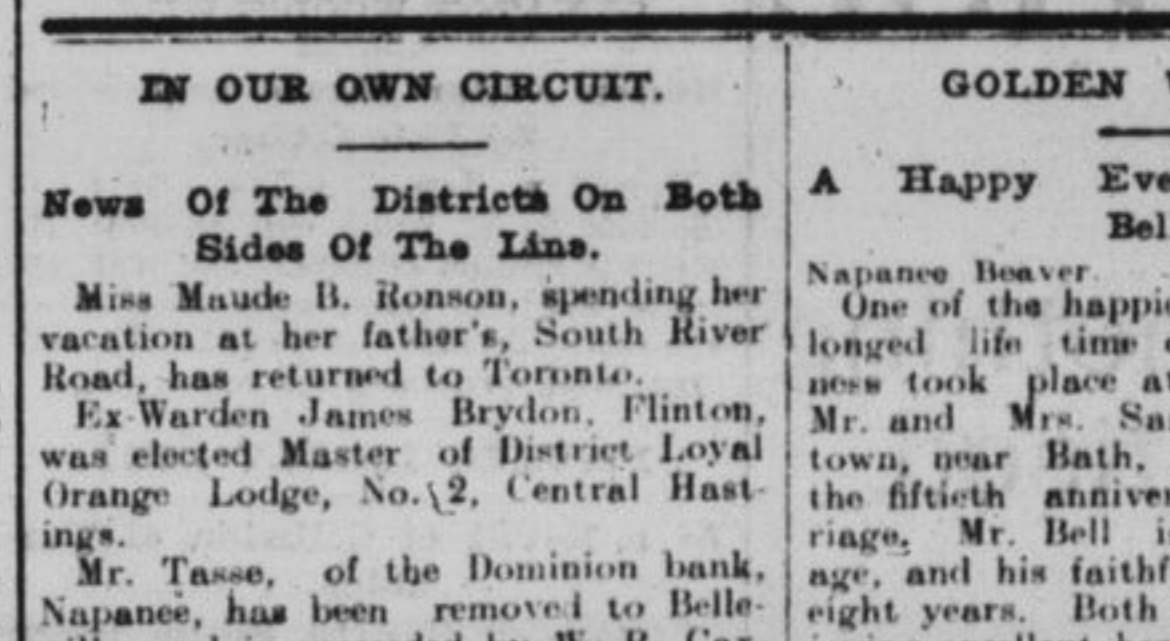
