



After a fall in buying, which was very early during January, the United States is again coming into the British market for supplies of coal and iron. One firm of London agents

is said to have an inquiry for 100,000

to 300,000 tons of coal and shippers

on this side are talking of sending

coal to the United States for the re-

mainder of the year. Ten steamers

were chartered within ten days to

convey Cleveland iron across the

Atlantic and in consequence the iron

market is holding its own with con-

siderable firmness.

Lord George Hamilton, in a public

speech on the Venezuelan question, de-

scribed the report, which has been wide-

ly circulated in Germany that he sta-

ted, at Kendal, on January 16th, that

the British government first sug-

gested Anglo-German co-operation

against Venezuela. So far from this

being the case, Lord Hamilton says

that Germany, last September, pro-

posed that she should co-operate with

Britain in the blockade which the

British government had resolved to

apply to the blockade.

Joseph Battell, of Burlington, Vt., a

millionaire landlord of Middlebury,

has offered to build the burnt portion

of that town, on condition that no

saloons must be opened in the village.

A meteorological observatory is to

be placed in spire of the cathedral at

Ulm, one of the largest churches in
