A quarter of a century ago it was difficult to procure a copy of the Bible in France. Last year, however, one society in Paris alone sold an average of seven hundred and fifty Bibles per day for six months.

Rev. Dr. Williams will enter his resignation with the church of St. Matthew's Lutheran church, of Philadelphia, Pa., recently told his congregation that he would like the children of the street to play and study in his Sunday school rooms each week day with a view to protecting them from evil.

In the early part of the last century non-conformity had only one particular champion. The century saw John Wesley, a Quaker, a member of the calvinist, and Thomas Ellis, a Calvinist Methodist, a chief whip. There are about a hundred and ten Protestant Nonconformists in the present House of Commons.

In 1790 the church, Missionary Society had only two unmarried women on the roll of missionaries; at the present time there are about three hundred and eighty, of whom eighty are fully qualified doctors, twenty-five are trained nurses, and the remainder are engaged in educational or evangelistic work.

A South Sea Islander, at the close of a religious meeting, offered this prayer: "O God, we are about to go to our homes. Let not the words we have heard be like the fine clothes we wear, soon to be taken off and folded up in a box until another Sabbath comes round. Rather let Thy truth be like the tattoo on our bodies, inseparable and deathless."

In the day of Sunday excursions and Sunday games it is especially necessary for young Christians to know what is God's will in this matter. His word says, "Forsake not the assembly of yourselves together. It is lawful to do good on the Sabbath day." The day is to be "holy," that means set apart, kept for sacred uses. In the spiritual surroundings, of God's house, its devotion, its instructions, and its sacred song is to be found a refreshing for every part of our wonderful life make-up, such as can be found nowhere else. Not only does God desire an outward observance of His day, but our very thoughts must be in harmony.

A very remarkable circular, signed by the leading ministers of the various Protestant denominations in New York, including Rev. Frank Clark, the founder of the Christian Endeavor society, has just been sent to the ministers of the denominations in the United States. The circular calls for a national observance by Protestants generally, of the penitential season, extending from February 25th, Ash Wednesday, to April 10th, Good Friday, commonly called Lent, in view of the increasing tide of worldliness and sin. It prays that special sermons be preached, special services held, and that all places of worship be open daily for private prayer. Mrs. Margaret Bottoms, of King's Daughters' fame, is among the signers of the petition.

**FAMILIAR SONGS.**

**On In The Sully Night.**

One of the most popular of modern song writers was Thomas Moore, who not only wrote new words, but frequently composed the music. He was also an accomplished musician and singer, and has been known to sit down at the piano and in a few moments have written a song and sung it.

Tom Moore was born on a street in Dublin, Ireland, May 28th, 1779. While the father was attending to his duties down stairs in his shop the mother devoted herself to taking care of her babies and household work upstairs. She was a woman of more than ordinary intellect and character, and for her Tom's love never diminished. After the death of both over 4,000 letters written in the most endearing terms by him, were found among her papers.

His marriage to Beatie Dyke, an actress, was a happy one, but much sorrow came to him in his later years. His eldest son died early, and his second son died in youth and his only daughter met a tragic fate. She was kissing her hand to her father as he was going down the stairs one day, and fell over the banister and was killed. The melody was not a joyful nature and tender-hearted to the extreme. The death of his children changed his nature and he never after sang in public as he was fond of doing.

"On In The Sully Night," of which he was author and composer, he sang with entrancing sweetness. It has been extensively parodied, but it nevertheless remains a perfect poem and a perfect song.

The words of this well known song are old, of probable English origin, but a credit is given to Joseph W. Turner, who was born in Berlin, July 9th, 1818. He began life as a workman in a type foundry, being eventually found of music devoted every spare minute to his study. He finally became a music teacher and became a popular composer of vocal and instrumental music, for many years being musical editor of the Waverley Magazine. A volume of his compositions has appeared under the title of "The Musician's Gift."

An incident in connection with the song is told of the escape of a party of Union soldiers from the Confederates at Tyler, Texas, during the war. A tunnel had been partially completed when news reached the prisoners that Gen. Rankin was within a hundred miles. The adventurous boys decided that the tunnel route was too tedious to complete, so they undressed one of the boys that crossed a portion of the high fence, and one rainy night they fastened a rope around it. Some of their comrades gathered in a distant portion of the grounds and just as the rope was drawn in and the men dashed through the opening there was a rift in the clouds through which the stars shone brightly, and these words rang out in the night air and attracted the attention of the guards to that part of the encampment:
