HIS BIRTHDAY... The Pope Is Ninety Three Years Old... THEY'RE HIS JOY FUNCTIONS ARE CONSOLATIONS TO HIM.

How Much Longer Can He Participate in Them—A Few Months More Life and Leo XIII. Will Have Broken All the Records... Rome, March 2.—The pope, this afternoon, received in the throne room the members of the Sacred College and the Roman prelates, who presented his holiness with congratulations upon the occasion of his ninety-third birthday.

Numerous congratulatory messages have reached the Vatican, notably from foreign rulers. When admonished by his physician, Dr. Lipponi, not to over fatigue himself by the ceremonies of to-day and to-morrow, his holiness replied: "These functions are the chief consolations of my old age, I wish to enjoy them."
