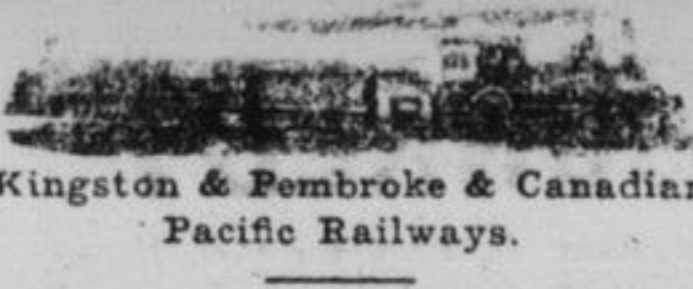

THE INSURANCE

PLACED UPON THE CIVIC BUILDINGS.

There Has Been a Big Cut in the Amount and Non-Tariff Mutual Companies to be Given Premiums.

At last night's session of the city council the finance committee made this recommendation:

That on the question of the city's insurance, all policies now held by the city be cancelled, that insurance be carried in non-tariff stock companies, to the following extent: City buildings and contents, \$20,000; No. 1 fire station, \$1,500; No. 2 fire station, \$1,000; court house and contents, \$1,000; crystal palace, \$3,000; agricultural hall, \$1,000; poultry building, \$500; caretaker's residence, \$500; weigh house, \$500; total, \$25,000. The committee be authorized to apportion the risks.

Aldermen King and Kent moyed its adoption.

Alderman King felt assured that the council was united in a desire to do something in regard to lessening the heavy charge upon the city for insurance. The recommendations contained in the report had been made only after the committee had gone carefully into the matter. The city had been carrying insurance upon the portraits in the city hall, which was a useless expenditure, since in the case of loss, they could not be replaced. The city building itself was the main item in the report. The committee felt that in the event of fire the building could not suffer a loss of \$12,000, the amount of insurance now carried; a short time ago insurance on the building was only \$25,000. The committee had considered the question of placing stand pipes in the building. Upon the advice of the chief of the fire department, the insurance on the city hall had been reduced. As regards the court house, the committee was of the opinion that the city's interests were best protected by \$6,000 insurance. With reference to the buildings in the fair grounds, no company could be found paying \$11,000 insurance on them in the event of fire, so the committee reduced the amount to \$5,000. He considered that the tariff insurance companies had not been treating the city fairly. The Board of Education was paying only six-five cents for three years, and it was preposterous to charge the city from \$1.10 to \$1.20 for its risks. If non-tariff companies would take the city risk, they would be approached. He considered risks placed with such companies quite safe.

Mayor Bell informed council that non-tariff companies would carry the city's risk at from sixty-five to seventy cents.

Alderman Craig felt assured that the committee was quite capable of handling the important matter, and he had faith in its recommendation. If non-tariff companies are reliable, as claimed, the rate they would charge should have largely to do with the amount of insurance carried.
