It Will Do Much To Save Children. IT KILLS GERMS.

THE CAUSE OF THE DREADED CHOLERA INFANTUM. It is expected that the Preparation will be ready for Practical Use This Year—Rockefeller Has Plans for an Hospital.

Baltimore, March 7.—Another great discovery, the anti-toxin which shall destroy the germs of cholera infantum, the disease which carried off John E. Rockefeller's little grandson 'Jack' McCormick, is announced by Dr. Simon Flexner, director of the Rockefeller Institute of Medical Research.

It was the death of this child, that turned the Standard Oil magnate's attention to the absolute inability of the medical profession to cope with the disease that annually carries off many thousands of infants.

In one of the private lecture-rooms of the Johns Hopkins hospital Dr. Simon Flexner and Dr. J. P. Lusk of the University of Pennsylvania, declared that as a result of their investigations the qualities of the needed serum had been discovered and that the perfecting of it would occupy but a few months longer.

TAX SYSTEM

Is To Be Revolutionized by Legislature. RENTAL VALUE. MERCHANTS AND OTHERS WILL PAY ON THIS.

Personal Property Tax is to Be Wiped Out—An Entirely New Assessment Law For The Province—The Draft Bill is Ready. Toronto, March 7.—The announcement is made that the Ontario assessment commission's draft bill would be introduced into the legislature at a government session during the coming session and then referred to a special committee for full consideration.

Inasmuch as this bill contains many revolutionary provisions, it will likely be the uppermost topic during the session. The draft bill contains a large number of changes, but the principle alterations, as set out in the report, may be summarized, as follows:

Personal property tax to be abolished, including mercantile stocks and manufacturing stocks and machinery. A tax to be substituted therefor based on the rental values of premises occupied by traders, manufacturers, financiers, and mercantile houses, private bankers and brokers excepted.

Taxation of all other persons than those above mentioned, including private banks and brokers, by indirect method upon all income above \$1,000 yearly. This taxation to be in proportion to the rental value of the premises occupied by their business.

Income from investment are taxed directly subject to exemptions. A house tax to be imposed upon all owners and occupiers of houses, used as dwellings, based upon the rental value of the premises.

Franchise-holding corporations, such as street railways, telephone and telegraph companies, and others making use of the highways in their business, to be assessed for this right to use the public land. This tax to take the place of taxes on gross receipts, and the right of use, as well as the structure of the highways, that is, poles, rails, wires, etc., to be assessed at the actual value.

Appointment of a provincial board of assessment for certain corporations, which shall collect the taxation and distribute it among the municipalities affected.

OTIS HOUSE DESTROYED.

Well Known Watertown Hostelry a File of Ashes. Watertown, N.Y., March 7.—The greatest fire that has afflicted Watertown since 1842, yesterday, totally destroyed the Otis house and seriously damaged some adjacent buildings.
