The Canadian Pacific has been subto cope with the situation created by last year's huge western harvest. It is the engines call for their delivery between June and July of this year livery before 1904. A contract, it is further stated, has been made with a Toronto firm, that if they will start works there the Canadian Pacific will take ten locomotives from them be fore 1994. The Canadian Pacific authorities, it is understood, are anxicus to have facilities in Canada for the building of their locomotives. All of the freight cars added to the rolling stock were built in Canada, and all but 750 of them in the company's shops at Perth, Montreal and Farnham. At present orders are placed for 664 cars in the company's shops and for 1:450 cars in the shops of Canadian manufacturers. Most of these cars are of large size, taking 1,500 ushels each.
