Ottawa, March 12 .- Parliament op ened this afternoon with the usual eremonies. The session promises to be a long and busy one. In the first place the government has a long and imporant bill of fare for presentation and public and private bills are to be inpected, will be the question of paramount importance, and the struggle between the Trans-Canada and the Grand Trunk railways will be watched with interest. Both companies will no doubt ask for public aid and the Trans-Canada people think they have the best of it. They already have a charter and added to this, have the support of many of Sir Wilfrid Laur-

ier's followers from Quebec, The revision of the tariff is another matter that will demand much attention. The deputations that will be pre sent from all parts of the Dominion will keep the grass on parliament hill well worn, for the indications are that the session will extend far into the summer.

Among the other important government measures will bill providing for a railway commission, and a bill providing for the settlement of railway strikes by arbitration.
