The settlers who saw him raise the nets, men who were born on the Mississippi banks, declare they never before saw a lyng. There are two reasons for this: The chief one being that these large lyng sleep all day and seek their prev at night which fall easy victims to the lyng. They are quite capable of doing away with fish from one or two pounds weight. The other reason is that men fishing for ordinary fish never use large enough bait, and there is no doubt but what the lyng have destroyed the pickerel that were deposited in those waters over twenty five years ago. The same reason may be given for the disappearance of the salmon in Pike lake in the

The early settlers around the lake shore well remember when salmon ranging from eight to twenty-eight pounds were taken from these waters plentifully. But for the last twenty years salmon has not been seen in the waters of Pike lake. And the that lyng are so numerous in lake, that they can be thrown out the surrounding creek with pitch forks. plainly shows that the salmon have been completely overcome by the lyng. Where salmon abounded in early day they would no doubt thrive in same lake again if the lyng could be I taken out, But, unfortunately, there is no way of taking out lyng, excepting with the hoop nets, and these often used to raise pike, bass und




