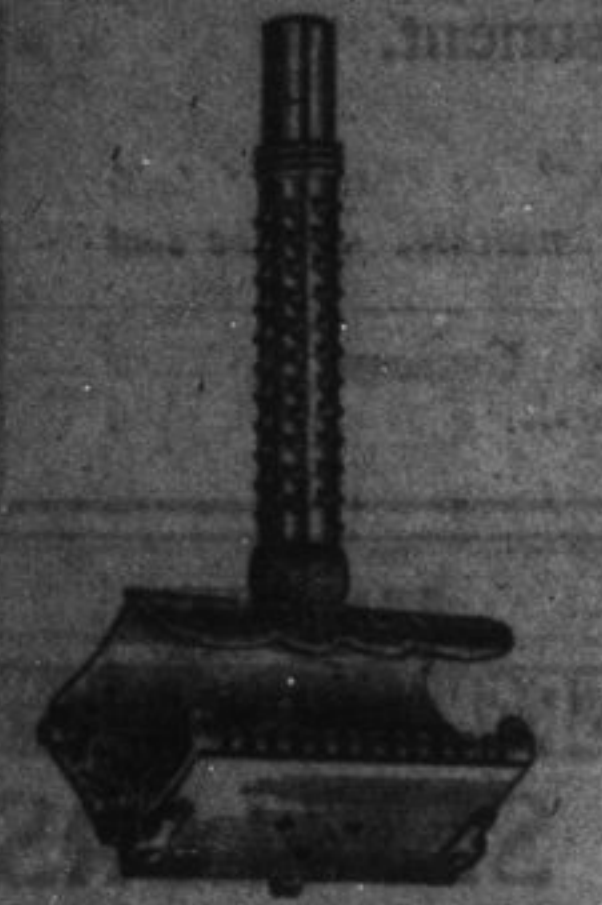

CONDEMNING ONE UNHEARD

The Hamilton Spectator thinks that Hon. Mr. Ross should have promptly accepted the resignation of Hon. Mr. Stratton.
