trimonial Agency London, March 21.-The story of Sir Gordon Macgregor's rescue woman, who, it was said, was an American, and who intended to marry him, has already been cabled. Apparently he will secure a wife, but she is not an American. The story of the afflicted baronet's misfortunes has incidentally brought to light a remarkable agency, which, however, is not unparalleled.


