Woman Drowns Herself. Miss Beardale, a Gouverneur Miller, Ends Her Life. Gouverneur, N.Y., March 31.-Miss Sarah A. Beardale, a milliner of this place, about fifty years of age, committed suicide Saturday night, by drowning herself in the Oswegatchie river at a point about midway between Main and William street bridges.

Key and Harold Rose-placed guilty and were held to the circuit court to answer to the charge of breaking and entering cars for the purpose of committing larceny.

200,000 MONKS MAY COME. Ask Vatican For Permission to Cross the Atlantic. Rome, March 31.-Up to the present time 57,000 members of the French congregations, who have been expelled from France by the law of associations, have asked to be allowed to transfer their organizations to America.

An Attempt To Wreck an Intercolonial Train Near Halifax. Halifax, N.S., March 31.-An attempt was made to wreck the Maritime express of the Intercolonial railway from Halifax on Saturday evening near Stewiacke, obstructions being placed on the track in the shape of fish plates. One was wedged solidly in the joints of the rails, and another spiked so as to rest in a dangerous position on the rail.

Make an Arrangement. Tickets on the Two Lines Are Now Interchangeable. London, March 31.-It is announced that the example of the Burgoyne trust has led the Cunard and the Allan lines to enter into a working arrangement to make passenger tickets interchangeable for return from New York and Quebec by way of Montreal and Quebec by the Allan line in summer, and from St. John and Halifax in winter.

Well-Known Doctor Is Dead at Durand, Mich.-Came From Fort Hope. Durand, Mich., March 31.-George H. Durand, a prominent physician and resident of Durand, is dead. He was born near Fort Hope about thirty-five years ago. After taking a course in dentistry, he located at Marine City, where he practiced three years, when he went to Baltimore to study medicine in the University of Maryland. He came to Durand eight years ago.

Sheriff Over-Exerted Himself. Golden, B.C., March 31.-Sheriff Hodgrave dropped dead while making an arrest for disorderly conduct. Death is ascribed to heart failure, induced by over-exertion.

Religious Unrest in France. Christian Intelligencer. The religious condition of France at the present time is one of great interest. Though Protestants number less than one million in a population of thirty-six millions of nominal Catholics, they exert an influence many a fold beyond their numerical strength. Their affair directed special attention to them through the efforts of their leading men in behalf of truth and justice, and won the appreciation of the liberals, a better acquaintance with the Roman Catholic clergy, a large and steady exodus from their ranks, and increasing difficulty in securing candidates for the priesthood. Besides this there is a general movement toward reform within the church, a demand for a restoration of the old-time Gallian liberties, and a revolt from ultramontaniam.
