**STREET PAVING****COUNCIL DECIDES TO TAKE IT UP.**

Nine Blocks Will Be Paved At Once If Property Owners Are Satisfied To Pay Sixty-five Per Cent of the Cost—The Alderman in Charge of That Work Is About to Begin.

It is "up to" the ratepayers to give Kingston paved streets. The city council has taken the initiative and set the machinery in motion, and it now remains for the ratepayers to keep it moving by agreeing to the council's proposals. The matter of street paving has been under consideration for a long time by the city fathers, but at last it has reached a point where the board of works recommended that certain streets, published in their programme in Monday's issue, be paved this spring and the council accepted the recommendation.

A couple of important laws were also adopted, providing for sanitary means being employed in carrying refuse and manure through the city. Among other business considered was the agreement existing between the city and school of mines, touching the examination of samples of water submitted by the city; certain resolutions touching abolition of canal tolls and harbour charges; an important letter from the militia department relative to a permanent military camp here, etc.

When the roll was called those members found to be in their places: Alderman McLeod, Angrave, Ross, Knapp, McLean, MacGowan, McLaughlin, MacLeod, Bell, Walker, Stevens, Scott, Tal, Walker.

Alderman Bell was not present at the opening of proceedings and meanwhile Alderman Behan was asked to preside on motion of Alderman King and Walker. However, his worship deposed the temporary chairman before proceedings had advanced very far.

The minutes of the preceding meeting, as printed, and submitted, were adopted without objection.

Communications Considered.

James Tal, asking that the deed of the Montreal street retaining wall property be delivered to him. Board of works with power to act. City solicitor with notice of it. It was pointed out that the old wall was in a more dangerous condition than ever and, moreover, it was disturbing the sidewalk.

Mrs. Catharine Brown, Princess street, asking permission to erect a temporary fence across her property, let vacant for the continuation of Hartlets street. Board of works.

D. Grimshaw, asking for reduction of taxes on property situated in Place des Armes—Finance committee.

R. W. Forrest, in behalf of National Conference of Charities and Corrections, to come to Atlanta, Ga., seeking Kingston to send a delegation.

R. McLeod, City solicitor of the town of St. Thomas, asking council to adopt a resolution favoring the abolition of the Commerce act, so as to give municipalities unqualified right to go into municipal ownership of lighting plants.

City solicitor and finance committee.

City Treasurer—Inland, "I beg to ask you for instructions with regard to the payment of John Wright's salary, the sum, amount, \$600, usually placed in the budget as a provision for this purpose, was paid to the board of works, general appropriation in the budget of 1903." City solicitor and finance committee.

Alderman Walker presented the report of the committee on finance, recommending payment of the following accounts: Gas works, coal yard, \$120.00; R. McLeod, \$13.50; H. The committee made three further recommendations: "A report having gained currency that the government intended removing the batteries from Kingston on account of the unsatisfactory condition of Te de Ponte, barracks, your committee have investigated the matter and recommend that a deputation consisting of Alderman McLeod, and Mowat, with John McLevy and the city engineer, be sent to the minister of militia for Kingston, lay the same before the minister of militia."

In reply to a question by Alderman McLeod, Alderman Walker made a partial explanation of the reasons prompting the committee to make the last recommendation of the report. He asked that the committee be not asked for full details at the present time, however.

The report was adopted on motion of Alderman Walker and McLeod.

Street Paving Considered.

Alderman McLeod presented the report of the board of works, already published. Alderman McLeod and Sears moved its adoption.

With reference to street paving, Alderman Taft took the ground that the nine blocks laid in the past were the best in the city, which more money had been expended than any others, and over which less care, heavy loads ever passed. He was opposed to paving when the city had an unlimited supply of limestone.

Died In The Hospital.

Edgar and Rosario, of Joyceville, had made arrangements to remove to Kingston, N.W.T., and had planned to effect their departure there, when he was struck with typhoid fever. He came to Hotel Dieu hospital in this city, where he died on Monday. A widow, to whom he was married five weeks ago, survives.
