NO MORE EXAMINATIONS.

Changes Proposed by the Education Department.

The education department proposes to make some radical changes in the public and high school regulations. One of the most important changes will be the elimination of nearly all promotion examinations in the public schools, the only ones that will be compulsory on the pupils being the entrance examination for the high schools and the examination for junior and senior form teachers.

There will be no examination for the commercial course diploma. Considerable latitude will be given to local education boards to arrange their own courses of study. The department, however, will reserve the right to fix the minimum standard that all pupils must reach in order to guarantee the measure of education necessary.

Latin will be eliminated for teachers qualifying for the junior grades. The average marks necessary for teachers to obtain will be increased, the suggestion being forty per cent. on each paper, and sixty per cent. on the total.
