 A diagram, with tabulated statements of the annual production of bituminous coal in the United States, from 1867 to 1902, shows what marvelous progress this business has made. HE DEPENDENT TRUTH.
 Martin Luther Before Charles V. in 1521.
 The Luther league topic, for April 19th is based upon Jeremiah, I, 15-19. It was at the Diet of Worms, April 18th, 1521, that Luther stood before the emperor and the great men of Germany to defend the faith.
 The Pope had ordered that Luther's writings be destroyed. Charles V., the new emperor of Germany, on his way to hold the Diet of Worms, stopped at the castle of Frederick, who demanded that Luther be given a hearing before he should be condemned. He therefore ordered Luther brought before the diet. While he believed that some of Luther's writings were good, yet they were offensive at others. It was decided that there should be no argument, but the simple questions put to him whether or not he would recall all his writings.
 The diet was held in the palace of the emperor, Luther appeared on the evening of April 17th. His books were placed on a bench beside him, and he was asked to recant. First whether he acknowledged having written the books. Second, whether he would retract their contents or persist in them. He answered that the books were written by other men, and he gave time to think about the other answer. The next day (the 18th) the question was again put to him. It was here that Luther made his most famous speech, in which his various writings in both Latin and German. His enemies threatened and urged him, but he would recall nothing he had written.
 Finally he said: "It is not a matter for debate; these heresies have already been condemned by pope and council. Give us now an answer, not an evasion; an answer without horns!" And here is the answer he gave:
 "Since your imperial majesty and your excellencies desire straight-forward answer, an answer will I give having neither horns nor hooves, nor construction, nor other money, nor of scripture or through clean reasoning—for I believe neither popes nor councils of themselves, it being clear just closed, and that another was saved as by fire. Out upon such processes as they make destroyers of men, who have in charge young men and women of the finest mold in the world, and yet they are crucified by their lives!
 And if we crucify with vitriol again a system obtaining in the art, scientific law and literary educational institutions, what shall be the charge against medical seats of learning? Medical schools are supposed to give the sanction of their high approval only to such systems or modes of study as tend to conserve the physical and mental status of the students. If a medical college in Kingston or elsewhere presumes to adopt any system which will not conserve the health of the lines, then that college is guilty of a criminal offense.
 It comes then, simply to this: That any college which incorporates the prime system of examinations held at the college is a proper system, this is a commendable system, this is a system that cannot be challenged!
 When I have the temerity to denounce and to challenge a system, I am not one who makes not the slightest pretence to any knowledge in the healing art. I do it upon an observation covering many years. It has greatly injured many whom I have seen pass through its fiery portals. It is up against the Kingston Medical College, or any other college, to defend the system if it is capable of any defence, which I have not the faintest doubt it is. The examination feature alone is open to the most savage attack, but when a prize feature is added the thing is quite beyond endurance. Once in my life I have privileged for a few months to be a student at the materia medica, and when I laid down the book to pursue other vocations, I said, "Woe to that I had a thousand years to pursue a profession as so interesting a profession as the materia medica." And yet shall it be said of the youth's sake? It is an encouraging sign of the times that several educational bodies, and several general bodies, have lately discarded the systems of examinations in toto.
 There may be instances in which examinations are a matter of necessity as where candidates for professional or other honors appear before boards to whom they are strangers, but whenever and wherever this fiery or watery ordeal can be avoided, it should be done. Our statistics show that nervous diseases, so called, are on the increase, and I believe that the system of examinations, as at present conducted in our educational bodies, is in a large degree responsible for such increase. At any rate, until the system can be defended, it should be abolished.
 I would not say that systems of examinations could not be devised, that might not be beneficial both as a means of mental discipline, and as factors in the acquisition of knowledge, but I repeat that any system of examination that is founded upon newspaper notoriety, and that is made the standard and passport of academic or honorific degrees, and which is pernicious in the highest degree, and is simply a barbarian. And so, Mr. Editor, I am led, with your permission, to make these few observations for the purpose of clearing up the matter, for if I did not so indite I would have as much of the former, and probably more of the latter.
