THE BUDGET

Will Be Brought Down In Imperial House.

SECRET SO FAR

AS TO WHAT IT WILL REALLY CONTAIN.

There Will Be a Stiff Fight Over the Subject of Taxation—The Present Ministry is to Be Fully Tested—It Has Made Enemies And Created Antagonisms.

London, April 22.—Parliament re-assembled yesterday, after the Easter recess, but there was nothing more important for the House of Commons to discuss than the sanitary condition of Holywell Palace. The real work of the session will commence to-morrow when Mr. Ritchie, who has played many parts in the political arena, will introduce his first budget. Nearly every newspaper has published a forecast of his intentions, but precisely what he is going to do is a mystery.

CHARLTON ON THE BUDGET.

Member For North Norfolk Gives His Views.

Ottawa, April 21.—Mr. Charlton delivered himself on the budget discussion today. He took up the trade issue, the extent of the tax on imports from Germany, and the German threat of retaliation which he would meet them.

New York, April 22.—Eugene A. Masterson, a former policeman, convicted of abduction, was sentenced to eight months in prison at hard labor. His attorney contended that the maximum sentence under the law at the time of the commission of the crime was five years.

A SMALL SURPLUS

In Public Accounts of the Province. Toronto, April 22.—The public accounts of the province for 1902 were presented to the legislature yesterday afternoon. The receipts are given as \$4,293,082, and the expenditure as \$4,245,963. The balance brought over from the year before is \$47,551.
