MUCH HONOR

SHOWN TO MEMORY OF SIR OLIVER MOWAT.

Lieut.-Governor of Quebec, Bishop of Ottawa, Lord Dundonald, and Representative Men From the Provinces Followed Remains.

Toronto, April 22.—The funeral of the late lieutenant-governor was indeed a fitting testimony to the universality of the respect and affection with which the man who had for so long controlled the political destinies of the province, has always been regarded by its people.

Among others, Bishop Hamilton, Ottawa, Sheriff Leger, Kent, N.B., and thousands of representatives of liberal associations throughout the province.

The procession then moved off an already unbecomingly high and crowded horse back, Lieut.-Col. Garssett, chief of police, leading the way, followed by a squad of mounted policemen, a troop of cavalry, under command of Maj. Williams and Capt. St. Andrew.

The speakers of the senate, Chief Justice Taché, and other chief justices, Lord Dundonald and Capt. Newton, members of the senate, Speaker Flint, of the commons, several of the Ontario judges, about thirty members of the commons, the provincial cabinet, Speaker Charlton and the members of the legislature in twenty-two carriages, clergy, county court judges, foreign consuls, staff of the universities and colleges, officials of the civil service, the mayor and all the city aldermen, led by Amelia Irving, K.C., treasurer of the law society, the medical and other professions, about 100 officers of the militia in uniform, and many and separate schools, Toronto Board of Trade, societies and clubs, including all the Scottish societies of the city, all the liberal clubs of the city and representatives of the liberal associations throughout the province.

The last of the procession was made up of citizens in carriage and citizens on foot.
