**LIFE OF CRIME.**  
**TRIPLE POISONER FINALLY  
REACHES THE GIBBET**  
After Deceiving Many Officers and  
Physicians—Used Subtle Drug  
With Cunning—Murderer Hunt-  
ed to Death.  
On October 22nd, 1902, Maude Eliza  
March, a girl of eighteen who had been  
for about a year the reputed wife of  
George Chapman, of the Crown Public  
house, Hugh street, Borough, London,  
England, lay on her deathbed. For  
four months she had undergone periods  
of intense suffering from some obscure  
disease, which her medical attendants  
and the staff of Guy's hospital had  
failed to diagnose. About noon of that  
day, her mother, her husband and a  
nurse, Jessie Toon, being then in the  
room, Maude said "My mouth and  
throat seem on fire, give me some  
ice." Chapman, who throughout had  
been assiduous in his attendance and  
attentions, gave her some brandy and  
dear the rest, and in a few minutes  
she became very sick. Chapman, noticing  
it, said to the nurse, "The old no-

ther's ill now. You had better tell her  
to go to bed out of the way—the old  
cat." Just after that Maude called out  
"I'm going." "Where?" replied Chap-  
man. Then after a brief pause, "Good-  
bye, George," said the poor girl in a  
whisper, and so she died.  
A post-mortem examination revealed  
beyond all doubt that Maude March  
had been done to death by means of  
antimony given in the form of tartar  
emetic. Twenty grains of her body was  
saturated with the poison—no less  
than twenty grains being recovered.  
As a dose of the drug for medicinal  
purposes varies from one-sixth to one-  
quarter of a grain, and two grains  
have been known to be fatal, there  
could be but one conclusion. Other  
suspicious circumstances clearly point-  
ed to George Chapman, who was  
accordingly arrested on a charge of  
murder. In his house at the Crown  
were discovered various medical books  
and most damning evidence of all—a  
red label bearing the name of W. H.  
Davidson, chemist of Hastings, Eng.  
land. It was a barter in that town  
Chapman had purchased, on April 3rd,  
1897, one ounce, or 437 1/2 grains, of  
tartar emetic at the cash price of one  
shilling. While in town a group pho-
