The Peoples Milk company of New York, was incorporated on Saturday with a capital of \$25,000,000 to deal in milk and cream.

NEW CHWANG.

THE RUSSIANS HAVE AGAIN OCCUPIED IT

And Are Busy Making Warlike Preparations—What is Said About it in London.

Pekin, May 8.—The Russians, it is announced, have re-occupied New Chwang with a large force and also the two garrisons in the forts at the mouth of the Liao river. They are further reported to be making extensive warlike preparations.

London, May 8.—Tipping Ta Yen, Chinese ambassador to England, is referring to the report that Russia had re-occupied New Chwang, to-day: "If the advice that Russia has occupied New Chwang are true they come the nearest to forecasting the war of the East. It is evident that a coup d'etat has been accepted which has for its ultimate object the complete Russian occupation of Manchuria, and gives the lie to Russian assurance that she will not so protruded that she will not offer any resistance to the czar, but there is no doubt that the Peking government will appeal to America, France and Japan. In my opinion these powers have so much at stake that they must compel the evacuation of New Chwang even at the cost of hostilities."

The announcement is taken here to mean that the town has been re-occupied by the force, the withdrawal of which was announced in April, when the Russians said that all the troops, except the men necessary for the police guards, had been removed.

LORD SACKVILLE'S HEIR. The Claimant's Application Regarding Witnesses.

London, May 8.—Another chapter in the sensational claim of Henry Sackville-West to be the legitimate heir of Lord Sackville, former British minister at Washington, was heard in the chancery court. The claimant whose full name is Ernest Henri Jean Baptiste Sackville-West, applied for the appointment of a commission to examine witnesses in France and Spain in support of his claim. Counsel for the plaintiff explained that the action was for the purpose of perpetrating testimony in support of his claim to the title and estate, as, while Lord Sackville was alive, the plaintiff could not bring action to establish his rights.

Henry Sackville-West, counsel retained, claimed to be the eldest son of Lord Sackville by his marriage with Josephine de Portage previously had been married to Antonio de la Oliva, who was then still alive, and it is not known whether the court granted the application.

It is learned that 277 of the 283 synagogues of the Presbyterian church in America, voted yesterday for creed revision as based on the eleven overtures sent down by last year's general assembly.

A Free Donation. Boston, Mass., May 8.—The steamer Adrian reached here yesterday, having in her hold 180 cases containing the casts, and parts of casts, given to the international union, who have been ordered by the Hanover court, and will be transferred to a private asylum.

Mentally Disordered. Berlin, May 8.—Prince Prosper von Arenberg sentenced in 1900 to fifteen years imprisonment at Hanover for savage cruelties while serving as an officer in German South Africa, has been declared to be mentally disordered by the Hanover court, and will be transferred to a private asylum.

Go Out in Sympathy. San Francisco, May 8.—To-night all of the boiler-makers of the Southern Pacific company west of El Paso and Ogden, and south of Portland, will quit work in sympathy with members of the international union, who have been out for six months on the Union Pacific. The number of men involved is about 420.

From Poverty To Much Wealth. El Oro, Mexico, May 8.—August Sahlborg, a multi-millionaire mining man, is dead. He came to El Oro ten years ago from Montana, without money or friends, and after many months of hard labor struck the vein of what is now the famous Esperanza mine, which yielded him a fortune of more than \$15,000,000.

To Help Starving Chinese. Washington, May 8.—Prompted by the report of General M. Wade that many Chinamen in the Kwangsi province were starving because of the drought, the Christian Herald of New York, has sent \$5,000 to the state department for the relief of famine sufferers in that part of China.

Left For Salonica. Toulon, May 8.—Following the receipt by Admiral Pottier, of cipher orders, the French flagship Admiral Potin and the armored cruiser Latoneau Breuille sailed for Salonica early to-day.
