TRANSACTION BY BOARD OF WORKS.

Street Railway Company Granted Permission to Alter Curves—Petitions Dealt With—The Overhead Bridge Matter.

When the city engineer's "Council" met at a regular meeting of the board of works Thursday afternoon, he found the following members present: Aids, Sears, Hong, King, Bass, Waldron, Manufacturing, Chairman McLeod.

The city solicitor wrote the board that he understood the railroad company would alter the curves; the company would have to put up a deposit guaranteeing that the roadbed would be placed in proper condition after the work had been done; the alterations would be done subject to his approval.

On motion of Aid, Macfarlane, it was decided to recommend that the change be permitted, the city engineer and city solicitor approving.

The street railway company asked permission to construct a switch on King street, between West and Simcoe streets.

It was pointed out to the board that the city engineer had power to deal with this request, but the official preferred bringing it before the committee for consideration.

After a short discussion, it was decided to have the matter in the hands of the city engineer, subject to the approval of the committee.
