The Riot In The Montreal Railway Strike.

ARE TO SHOOT

IF STRIKERS REFUSE TO DISPERSE WHEN ORDERED.

Motorman Dying From Injuries - Street Car Company Say They Will Have Cars on All Routes To-morrow.

Montreal, May 26.-In the police court Joseph Limoges, one of the strike leaders who took part in the rioting on St. Denis Street, was sentenced to six months in jail with hard labour.

Some twenty strikers and sympathizers, who participated in Sunday's troubles in a less prominent way, appeared in the recorder's court and were fined small amounts, ranging from \$3 up.

TORNADOES DEAL DEATH.

Southern Nebraska Swept by Series of Fierce Storms.

Hastings, Neb., May 26.-A series of heavy storms, two of which developed into the worst tornadoes that have visited Southern Nebraska for years.

Two miles south of Upland, German Lutheran services were being held in a school house when the storm struck and demolished it, killing four.

The storm was equally destructive at Fairfield, but the people were warned of its coming and sought cover.

Every dwelling and outbuilding in the path of the tornado was blown to pieces.

The family of Peter Hockinson, nine in number, was reunited late in the evening.

There were two tornadoes, both striking within a mile of Fairfield.

The greatest loss of property was sustained by farmers.

Charles Taylor, who places the blame on his stock and farm, including cattle and horses killed, at \$21,000.
