THE TEMISKAMING RAILWAY LINE TO G.T.R. Toronto, May 27.—Premier Ross made the announcement in the house last night, that it was no part of the government railway programme of the government to amend the bill to amend the Temiskaming and Northern railway act, Mr. Ross hinted that the government might consider the advisability of leasing the road for a sum sufficient to pay the bonds issued for its construction, but the government was not going to give the road away. The bill which provides for the issue of bonds, instead of debentures, to the amount of about \$2,700,000, for the construction of the road and its extensions passed its second reading...

St. Petersburg, May 27.—The chief of police of Kiev has ordered the police commissaries within his jurisdiction to institute a fresh inquiry into the legal status of the Jews and to forcibly expel those who have no legal right of residence and who refuse to leave. A Jewish deputation from Kishineff recently had a long audience with Minister Von Pliginsk. The minister being a Jewphobe, and said he had not opposed taking proceedings against the former governor of Kishineff, Gen. Von Rathen, and the local administration of Kishineff. The minister promised sympathetic consideration of the facts set forth in the petitions of the Jewish population for future protection. Consequently, the minister has suppressed the distribution of Kishineff's new anti-semitic organ, the Znamis.

MANY ON SERVICE... The Street Railway Service Generally Extended... Several of the suburban lines were operated to-day for the first time, in addition to several city lines which have been idle since the strike commenced. The company reports that more of the strikers are going back to work. Everything is quiet, the strikers having shown no signs of attempting to interfere in any way with the operations of the company. At noon the street railway company stated they had 105 cars in operation with the service being well maintained.

Rome, N.Y., May 27.—With the halter rope tied around her wrist and a ligatured coil travelling at a frightful pace, twenty-year-old Rena Webster, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Andrew Webster, a prominent family in North Western, was dragged a quarter of a mile over a rough highway yesterday and killed. Miss Webster led the coil out in front of her home to allow it to eat of the grass that grew along the highway. While the coil was feeding the cat down by the roadside and worked on a doilie. To prevent the animal from getting away she fastened the end of a long halter rope to her wrist. Suddenly the animal became frightened. Miss Webster was dragged headlong into the roadway and the horse ran into the village of North Western, a quarter of a mile away, at a furious pace, still dragging the girl. The horse was stopped by villagers and the girl died a few minutes later.
