Ottawa, June 3.—The appointment of Judge Brifton as commissioner in charge of the Grand Trunk concession inquiry was criticized by the opposition and defended by the government in the commonsensical, yesterday. Mr. Brifton's railway bill was further considered and in supply customs estimates. It is generally understood that there are three tenders for the fast Atlantic service emanating from the Canadian Pacific railway, the Allan and the Dominion steamship companies. A ministerial caucus has been summoned for Friday next when it is expected that the ministry will make known their intentions in regard to aiding the Grand Trunk, Pacific and the Canadian Northern railways.
