FORMISIONS. ELOQUENT APPEAL OF THE GENERAL SECRETARY. The Church Needs \$75,000 For Missionary Work—Sums Yielded by Some of the Churches—The Society Has Great Work To Do.

At Wednesday's session of the Ontario synod, a very interesting and instructive address on the subject of missions was delivered by Rev. L. N. Tucker, general secretary of the board of missions. The address was forcible and full of facts. Heartily applause punctuated its delivery, and at its conclusion the bishop took occasion to thank the speaker for his lucid explanation of the workings of the board of missions...

The society's work is limited to the wide world. The church is called the light of the world, and the church must give its torch to light the heathen lands. The missionary society is like a large board of management of the missionary interests of the church. The Canadian field of the missionary society is limited only by the north pole on the north, the Atlantic on the east, and the Pacific on the west...

Ontario diocese was set down for \$4,000 towards the sum needed, which amounting to \$1,000,000, surely a John Macdonald, would not refuse to do its duty in regard to this matter. Kingston, also had the honor of being the birthplace of the Church of England in Upper Canada, and he felt assured that the historic city would do its duty towards the maintenance of that church. St. Paul's church, Toronto, had been apportioned \$2,000. The diocese of Ottawa had been apportioned \$3,100, and the lord bishop had said the diocese could not raise the amount. But the whole surplus on one Sunday, much to the surprise of the lord bishop, the congregation of St. George's church, Quebec, yielded \$2,000 in one week, and has since increased the amount to over \$3,000. St. John's church, Toronto, has given so far \$2,500 and the rector hopes to make it \$3,000. In one year, because of the adoption of a book-collection system, the missionary givings of Quebec diocese have jumped from \$3,000 to \$9,000.
