NEW ZEALAND

IMPOSED TEN PER CENT. EXTRA ON FOREIGN GOODS.

Not Probable That This Will Shut Out Goods To The Advantage Of Great Britain—An Election Is Apparently Nearer.

London, June 18.—In moving his motion in the House of Commons last night, Sir Henry Campbell-Bannerman said that Mr. Balfour's and Mr. Chamberlain's speeches had roused the hopes in the colonies, which might be bitterly disappointed. He asked Mr. Balfour to say if the government had a definite policy or to make a positive declaration that the great changes assumed by New South Wales are not and may never be the government's accepted policy. He further wanted the prime minister to say that the country shall not be gradually committed against its will, and without its knowledge to changes so vast and critical.

MET WITH DEFEAT.

Called For Revision on Protectionist Lines.

Ottawa, June 18.—Mr. Tarte, yesterday, introduced his long promised amendment calling for the immediate revision of the tariff on protectionist lines. The effect was a lengthy one, and only moderately effective so far as the House of Commons was concerned. Much of it was of the nature of a campaign pamphlet, and was not out relation, whereas Mr. Robinson represented a great deal of compilation work, and abounded in statistical tables, and extracts from books, pamphlets, etc., intended to support his case. Mr. Tarte was on record again as a pronounced protectionist, an admirer of Mr. Chamberlain, and in favor of imperial preferential trade.
